THE WING – A 21ST CENTURY VIEWING

The following paragraphs are based on an article by Flight Sergeant Chaz McKnight for "LZDZ" the House Magazine for Joint Helicopter Command. The photographs are courtesy of Warrant Officer Mark Farrell. See if you can spot him in one of the photographs!

In Afghanistan on Op HERRICK, TSW maintains a permanent 22-person detachment. The main task is to provide Forward Refuel Point (FRP) capability in support of deliberate operations 'outside of the wire' as well as maintaining a 24/7 Rotors Turning Refuel capability at BASTION and Forward Operating Bases (FOBs)s as required. Hoverrefuels and aircraft defuels are also undertaken when the situation requires. Additionally, the Wing supports the Combat Logistic Patrols that achieve the bulk movement of fuel by road to the FOBs.

Bastion is a huge base. It really is a small town with the attendant facilities. TSW have made themselves at home here over the years —as you would expect!

In Kenya during the Ex ASKARI THUNDER season or even during the Christmas break between exercises, TSW personnel support helicopters from Laikipia Air Base. This is the Main Operating Base where the fuel is received from Shell Kenya in road The fuel the goes through tankers as F35. extensive testing to ensure it is fit for purpose prior to it being blended with Fuel System Icing Inhibitor by TSW operators to produce AVTUR F34. TSW also have a dedicated refuel site at FOB SIMBA in 'Archers Post', guarded by the Massai when not in use. The Massai take their responsibilities very seriously and are armed with spears to fend off the lions and rodents (which are bigger than the lions!).

Additionally, TSW personnel can also be found moving around the bondu in Oshkosh Tactical Aircraft Refuellers (TARs) that provide a mobile

FRP capability wherever it is required.

For a few months of the year, TSW can be found in Oman supporting both fixed and rotary wing assets. This is predominantly a Wing Para Cadre tasking where the TSW personnel practice the air despatched Forward Refuelling Point (FRP) capability, using 'old faithful'- a couple of Air Portable Refuelling Containers, hoses, pump and filter. The equipment is squeezed into a frame for air delivery by C130. The TSW team then launch themselves after the Equipment and attempt to minimise the distance they need to run back to the landing point.

Spain is a more recent addition to TSW's exercise plot. In support of the European Air Group, the Wing is tasked with leading the international effort on deploying fuel capability forward in support of

an effort to rescue downed aircrew in a hostile environment. This allows the Wing to share expertise while at the same time educating its European Allies in delivering fuel in a tactical environment. TSW also deployed on Ex JEBEL SAHARA 10 to assist the Moroccan Royal Air Force by providing the knowledge and skill sets required to safely operate a rotors turning capability, fuels testing, accounting, assurance and equipment care.

THE PRESIDENT'S AWARD FOR 2010

We never cease to be amazed at the high calibre of the recipients of the President's Award; the winner of the 2010 Award, sponsored by JCB, was SAC Dan Ferrer and he is no exception. At a ceremony held in the Sergeants' Mess at MoD Stafford on 25th May, Dan Ferrer was presented with the President's Award trophy and certificate, together with a memento from JCB and a gift from the Association. The ceremony was followed by a buffet lunch.

The Citation:

Over the last year, SAC Ferrer has contributed enormously to TSW activities across a range of environments. His exemplary performance and overwhelmingly positive attitude have consistently prompted notable praise from his chain of command and all of his detachment commanders.

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On the departure from TSW of his Section IC, SAC Ferrer took control of the largest tanker pool in the RAF, for a period of 3 months. The size of the fleet, coupled with the high level of activity, constituted a sizeable task. He worked tirelessly from the outset, frequently on extended days, in order to ensure that the tankers were always ready to deploy. He supervised his peers admirably in carrying out the vehicle husbandry, equipment control and Millipore and strainer checks. The excellent level of communication he maintained with Mechanical Transport (MT) Control and the MT Maintenance Section and his supervisory performance continual were characteristic of a senior JNCO.

SAC Ferrer has also undertaken numerous deployments over the period. During Exercise ASKARI THUNDER in support of Joint Helicopter Force (Kenya), he was responsible for running the Forward Refuel Point at FOB SIMBA; a role usually assigned to a JNCO. He also completed numerous solo tasks to Mombasa to collect mission critical fuel equipment, demonstrating in a challenging environment that he is both shrewd and intelligent.

He also deployed to Morocco as Acting Corporal on Exercise JEBEL SAHARA in support of 18 Squadron's Pre-Deployment Training. The initial task was to interface with Host Nation (HN) personnel during fuel-related tasks; however, on arrival it became evident that there were significant issues with HN facilities and

procedures, including microbiological contamination and the absence of equipment and procedures for removal of static electricity. These shortfalls represented a serious risk to flight safety. The task immediately changed from one of liaison and cooperation to that of supervision and instruction on safe practices. Ferrer's expertise, diplomacy and initiative proved to be invaluable in bringing the HN vehicles up to the minimum safety standards, rectifying all electrical bonding issues on bulk fuel vehicles and conducting repairs to hose equipment and an overpressure valve. He also identified and solved the absence of groundearthing equipment on the tanker used to carry out rotors turning refuels. He then mentored the HN personnel through the Quality Assurance activity and refuelling procedures. He worked up to 18-hours per day for nearly 3 weeks until additional personnel could be deployed. Ferrer attracted notable praise from the Detachment Commander, while the detachment as a whole received a laudatory letter from the Commander of Joint Helicopter Force (Morocco) for services to Flight Safety.

Following a subsequent 6-week deployment on Exercise CLOCKWORK in Norway, the Detachment Commander identified Ferrer as being within the top 10% of all Airmen he had ever worked with. This was based on his positive 'can-do'

attitude and confidence. On this detachment, Ferrer completed the Extreme Cold Weather Survival Course and then, despite being newly qualified, delivered a presentation on the subject to personnel attending the subsequent course. He regularly volunteered for additional duties, executing them with supreme professionalism and good humour.

SAC Ferrer has voluntarily dedicated weekends to preparing the MT Hangar for a host of social events such as the TSW Christmas Ball and Families Day Hangar Bash. This task requires a considerable amount of work, which cannot be undertaken during the week due to activity in the hangar. He has also volunteered to work on the TSW Bar at many functions and has given up free time over numerous weekends to deliver TSW Following yet another detachment to Kenya, SAC Ferrer is now scheduled for Pre-Deployment Training and deployment to Afghanistan in September 2011. Over the last year, he has demonstrated immense loyalty, initiative and selflessness. He has shown great potential through his leadership of small teams in austere environments and represents a remarkable prospect for the Service. He embodies the 'War Fighter First' ethos and is utterly deserving of the award of Airman of the Year.

The 2011 AGM and DINNER

Main Points arising from RAFSC&TSW Association AGM held at the Sergeants Mess Stafford on 4th June 2011

The main points arising from the AGM were as follows:

- Two matters were outstanding from the 2010 AGM using the SAGA and RAFA House Magazines for advertising which the Chairman undertook to progress.
- In introducing the new OC TSW, Wing Commander Polly Perkins, the Chairman expressed the gratitude of the Association for the support provided by the Wing throughout the year. Without such support, the Association would find it difficult to sustain its activities. Particular thanks were due to Warrant Officer Mark Farrell currently overseas on an operational tour. Wing Commander Perkins then offered her narrative report, from which it was clear that the Wing was in good spirits and was as heavily committed as ever in support of operations and exercises; she concluded with a light-hearted historical comment on Equipment Officers!
- The Treasurer introduced the Accounts for the year ending 31st December 2010, which had been duly validated, and his report for the year was duly accepted by those present. The funds continued to be in a healthy state and proposals continue to be sought for the use of some of the Association funds.
- Current paid-up Membership stood at 224. Overall, membership numbers had increased by about 10% last year, while subscription monies remained fairly constant.
- The Chairman notified the meeting that Bob McBey's Bergathon Veterans' Team had been promised £250 towards their sponsorship and £120 had been committed for Team T Shirts.
- It was agreed that a donation of £250 would be given to the veterans' mental health charity Combat Stress.
- A proposal to take forward a project for the installation of a TSW crest plaque in the floor of the RAF Church, St Clement Danes, was agreed; a donation of £350 from Association funds was committed to the project with the balance to be sought through individual donations.
- Three Associate Members were proposed and agreed Sqn Ldr Jim Davies, Mr Joe Canning and Mr Paul Davies.
- The Chairman, Duncan Grant, and Treasurer, Tim Newstead, were re-elected for a further 2-year period of office; Duncan advised that he would not seek re-election in 2013 and that a new Chairman would, thus, be sought. Paul Giles was elected as Welfare and Publicity member.
- In discussion the meeting considered that, ideally, members would prefer the dinner to be held on the Saturday evening with an informal Friday gathering - as previously. However, there was recognition that the good offices of the Wing should not be prejudiced. Work in Committee would be undertaken to agree an optimum solution for 2012 with the foundation still resting at Stafford
